The Tebruary 1956 issue, No. 5 of the publication "light," self-described as a southly newspaper of, by and for the American Rightwing, which lists C. W. THOWS, editor, his Ellis Street, San President Eisenhouer, which includes a number of highly defenatory questions directed to the President. The following information concerns the background of "Right":

A prophiet entitled "Freedom of Choice" by ALINICH MARE, 269 Oppness Drive, Legums Beach, California, was submitted by the same informant in Capturber 1954. The contents of this peoplet supported segregation and opposed Communism. HEARE indicated that he was the head of the organisation "America Plus."

Another parchiet by ALEFICH BLANC entitled "The Job Can Be Kene" was submitted by the informant in etober 1954. In this publication BLANE indicated that "Liberty and Property" was the successor to "merics Plus" and that the administration of this organization was being taken over by WILLIS CHRTO of San Francisco. The address of "Liberty and Property" was listed as F. O. Box 180, San Francisco, California. The following background information concerning CARTO appeared in this pamphlet:

The informant added that CARTO was listed on the progress as convention chairman of the organization's convention scheduled for april 25-30, 1955, in San Francisco.

In August 1955 the informent submitted a communication under the letterhead of "Moberty and Property" which listed National Committee Advisors as follows: THIMS CHEICH, FRANK CUNNINGHAM, Cen. P. A. IEL VALLE, JAMES P. GIPSTH, St., RALPH CVINN, WILLIS E. STONE. An enclosure to this communication is a copy of a letter addressed to Mr. BLAKE and signed by WILLIS CART describing a trip allegedly taken by the latter to contact people concerning "Liberty and Property."

In Recember 1955 another informant who has furnished reliable information in the past provided a leaflet indicating that the San Francisco Libertarian Forum was presenting a speech by VILLIS CART entitled "Treason and Bankrupt Foreign Policy" on October 28, 1955, in San Francisco. CART was allegedly to provide the names of the real war originals who are still holding high office.

Inother informat who has furnished reliable information in the past furnished the information in November 1995 that YILLIS CARTY inside: the organisation "Morty and Property" and that he had recently been in contact with Netlandist leaders throughout the United States. Ros TILLIN CONT

In January 1966 an informant mentioned previously ordered a copy of the "First Mational Directory of "Aghtist" Groups, Publications, and Some Individuals in the "nited States and Some Foreign Countries" (Second Edition) from an unknown individual at \$18 Ellis Street, San Francisco. The unknown individual stated that he printed this material for WILLIS CAPTO of "Liberty and Property." The informant subsequently received the booklet through the mail. A foreword to this publication indicates that being listed in the directory does not imply acceptance or concurrence of the publisher with the viewpoint of the individual, organisation, or publication listed. All those listed allegedly represent a protest to "prevailing "leftist" political and/or social trends." Organisations, individuals, and publications listed are extremely varied and include not only conservative and anti-Communist organizations but also organizations and individuals who, to judge from their writings and publications, are of maist, anti-Semitic, and extremist orientation.

"The Augean Stables need to be cleaned. A Second American Revolution is needed. But this presents many problems, the main one being simply that our side is not yet nearly strong enough nor wall-organized enough.

"In the meantime, how can we cope with these grasping pressure groups? We must compete with them. We must compete with them. "At present there are a few offices and indviduals in Washington which do good wark insefar as their limited activities allow. But a much larger and truly coordinated effort is needed, one which will utilize the cooperative effort of all of our big patriotic groups. With the backing of the membership of the biggest dozen or so groups a LIBERTY LCHN will be in a position to speak out firmly for the right.

"A LIBERTY LOBEY will complement and supplement the grass-roots work of the verlous new party groups and political action groups. Far from there being any conflict



RACIAL MATTERS

Bureau has established a single fingerprint file of fingerprints of known or potential users of explosives in racial matter crimes.

The Bureau desires:

1) Names and aliases;

2) Descriptions and FBI or arrest numbers, of persons in so-called "hate groups" who might be inclined to violence such as bombings.

Concerning our current investigations, it does not appear they possess the requisite of being "inclined to acts of violence," on the basis of available data. 

The family came to Mansfield, Onio, about 1943 from Fort Wayne, Indiana. At the time, subject was a senior in high school and remained in Fort Wayne to graduate.

After high school, the subject entered the United States Army and served in numerous campaigns in the Far East. He reportedly was wounded and received the Purple Heart. After his military service, he attended Dennison College. The source did not recall as to whether he graduated. After this, he was affiliated with Proctor and Gamble, Cincinnati, Chio. He later terminated this position, and around 1950 or 1951, he went to Florida for a couple of months and "knocked around." 





On 3/20/59 CARTO was interviewed by the writer and SA FRANK S. PERRONE at his office, 1615 Polk St., San Francisco, relative to any information he might have concerning the possible identity of the subject of 100-44746, who is known to the Bureau only as "The Patriot." CARTO advised that inasmuch as most of the persons who engage in rightist activities do not attempt to conceal their identity, he himself had wondered who "The Patriot" might be. He stated that he had received some literature of an anti-Semitic nature with the pen name of "The Patriot" from various places in the country. He stated that he had not saved any of this literature. CARTO advised that he also had no knowledge of the present whereabouts of FRANCIS PARKER YOCKEY and had assumed that he was dead.

CARTO stated that his segment of those engaged in rightist activities does not indulge in hate activity, nor does it believe in engaging in any activity of an illegal nature. CARTO stated that he could not make a living with his rightist activity and was employed part time.

Any Agent contacting CARTO in the future should be aware of CARTO's extreme interest in the jurisdiction of the FBI insofar as its investigation of hate groups is concerned.

II. ACTIVITIES

On October 1, 1954, San Francisco T-3 furnished a pamphlet entitled "The Job Can Be Done" which stated that Liberty and Property was the successor to "Action Plus" and that the administration of this organization was being taken over by WILLIS CARTO. This pamphlet also indicated that Liberty and Property favors segregation, opposes communism and the United Nations. The address was listed as P.O. Box 180, San Francisco.

The pamphlet described CARTO as follows:

"Young CARTO was a combat veteran in World War II serving as an infantryman. He was wounded on Cebu (PI) and wears the Purple Heart. Following the war, he completed a pre-law course at Dennison University in Ohio and then went into the advertising department of a large business concern. Recently, one of his articles 'Washington's Farewell Address' appeared in the 'National Newspaper' published in Washington, D.C. He is a member of Toastmasters International, of the San Francisco Junior Chamber of Commerce and of the Congregational Church and is active in the American Legion."

On January 20, 1959, San Francisco T-4 advised that P.O. Box 180, is assigned to Liberty and Property, Inc., W. A. CARTO and was rented in July, 1954. CARTO's address at that time was 1312 Jackson Street, San Francisco, and the nature of his business was shown as "mail order."

The Articles of Incorporation filed by Liberty and Property, Inc. with the California Secretary of State, Sacramento, California, were examined on July 20, 1956. These articles, under #289632, asserted that the name of the corporation shall be Liberty and Property, Inc., whose stated purposes include the following:

"The initial business to be transacted by the corporation is formation of groups and committees for the purpose of exploring public grievances, and for the purpose of general public education on political, economic and social subjects.

"To do research in, and prepare model constitutional amendments and legis-lative enactments designed to inform the various citizens and members of a means of proper action for the preservation or restoration of personal liberties and property rights.

"To formulate, develop, and promote public interest and education in basic democratic principles, civil rights, and property rights through dissemination of information by all types of printed publications, radio, television and other means of dissemination of information...."

Other stated purposes generally state that it was provided for the corporation to receive, hold, and develop by prescribed means real and personal property for benefit of the corporation, to borrow money and incur indebtedness and to enter into contracts to further its objects.

These articles show that tax exemption as a civic league was granted to Liberty and Property.

The original Articles of Incorporation filed by Liberty and Property July 30, 1954 lists the following as officers:

WILLIS A. CARTO, 1312 Jackson Street, San Francisco, California; ROBERT R. HOBART, 122 Graham Avenue, San Jose, California; MARY T. FALKNER, 2939 Broderick Street, San Francisco, California.

On January 30, 1956, according to Articles of Incorporation, Liberty and Property entered a change regarding its officers, which listed WILLIS A. CARTO as both President and Treasurer, and BRUCE HOLMAN as Secretary. The address was shown as P.O. Box 180, San Francisco, California, and 1615 Polk Street, Room 6, San Francisco.

On November 1, 1955, SF T-3 furnished Progress Report #5 on the letterhead of Liberty and Property, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco. This report is dated October 14, 1955 and is addressed "To All Enrollees and Good Friends of Liberty and Property." This report in part stated as follows:

"It is necessary to create a means whereby all new developments and new-as well as tried and true ideas can be expressed.

L&P, being outspokenly pro-Capitalistic, believes that through the honest competition of ideas just as through the honest competition of goods the best of the lot will eventually prevail, and so result in the general welfare.

"Consequently, we are proud to announce that this marks the beginning of publication of 'Right', a new monthly bulletin, of, by, and for the American Patriotic Movement.....

> "In order to be effective, 'Right' intends to report, without bias or favoritism, all significant activity of the American Right Wing. define it, this means any organization or group which is interested primarily in one or two basic essentials qualifies for such matter. Because of the vast scope of the ideals envisioned by the groups concerned, these two criteria are necessarily negative. The two negative criteria are Anti-Marxism and Anti-Internationalism. Taken together, these two principles come close to meaning Americanism in our book.

This report identified the publication office of "Right" as 418 Ellis Street, San Francisco, and the Editor as CHARLES W. THOMAS.

This same report, under a caption "Growth of L&P", states as follows:

"In the few short months of the existence of L&P, an amazing amount of progress has been made. Step by step, our Organization Plan is being completed. New services were added constantly, all designed to build and strengthen the 'American Underground'."

On November 7, 1955,

San Francisco, a businessman, furnished the San
Francisco Office with a leaflet which states it was
issued by Liberty and Property, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco. This leaflet advertizes "The Second Edition of the New Enlarged First National Directory of 'Rightest'
Groups, Publications and Some Individuals in the United
States (and Some Foreign Countries)." This was identified

as a special service of Liberty and Property and listed the following as a partial group of attractions:

Anti-Internationalist groups!
Libertarian groups!
Anti-Communist and Anti-Socialist groups!
States' Rights groups!
Right to Work groups!
Anti-Fluoridation groups!
Religious groups!

On November 14, 1955, San Francisco T-5 furnished a copy of a mimeograph letter written by WILLIS CARTO, which stated that he had made a trip throughout the United States and contacted numerous Rightist Nationalist organizations and individuals. This letter also stated that CARTO was contacting groups which were against communism, against communist infiltrated state governments, the Supreme Court decision on segregation. This letter further states that he had also contacted groups. called the Citizens Councils of the Southern States. which are against desegregation. The letter stated that the purpose of his trip was to contact people concerning Liberty and Property with the end of gaining some important support for it. The letter indicated he had been successful in getting this support.

The February, 1956 issue of "Right", listing C. W. THOMAS as Editor, was set up in the form of an open letter to President EISENHOWER and directed numerous questions to the President. The following were included among these questions:

"Is it true that you and you alone are responsible for the surrender of Berlin to the Russians?"

"Did you cut off General Patton's gasoline so that he was unable to take the Balkans, as he was in the process of doing?"

"Did you and Harry Dexter White, who was then known to be a communist spy, hatch the Morganthau Plan in your London headquarters?"

"Were you responsible for turning over to the Russians some 70,000 highlytrained German scientists while we received only a few hundred? Are these men responsible for building Russia to a point of aerial and atomic superiority to us?"

"Mr. President, are you responsible for the murder of some two to five million anti-Communist Russians, Poles, Balts, and Balkanese?"

On June 29, 1956, San Francisco T-6 furnished a communication on the letterhead of Liberty and Property, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco, dated June 15, 1956, which was generally circulated to the enrollees of Liberty and Property, which contained in part the following descriptive information:

"Liberty and Property, Incorporated, is lots of things, primarily it is another one of the dozens of Right Wing political action groups. Consequently, we officially favor only our 10 proposed amendments to the Federal Constitution, called the Second Bill of Rights..... The point is that 'Right' is certainly not the official L&P publication at all. 'Right' stands staunchly on its own legs under the able leadership of its editor, Bradford Martin. Moreover, our National Committee advisors are even further removed from 'Right' because each one of these leaders is con-

cerned only with their own particular amendment, which is one of the 10 in the Second Bill of Rights. So you can see although L&P publishes 'Right' as a service to the American Right Wing, it is not in any way an official publication but speaks only for itself."

According to Dun and Bradstreet, this business consists of publishing a monthly political newsletter, but details regarding the publication and distribution were unknown to Dun and Bradstreet.

On October 1, 1956, SF T-3 furnished literature dated September 25, 1956 stating that the mailing address of "Right" was changed from 418 Ellis Street, San Francisco to P.O. Box 180, San Francisco.

On April 20, 1959, SF T-2 furnished a leaflet received by SF T-2 in August, 1956, which stated in part as follows:

"San Francisco Conservative Republican Headquarters, 1263 Market Street, San Francisco, California. Phone: Prospect 6-2896. Welcome! Greetings to you from your hosts." The leaflet then listed various individuals and their assignments and included WILLIS CARTO as coordinator.

The leaflet also reflected that "The San Francisco Conservative Republican Headquarters is a temporary service organism established for conservative Republicans to make their voices heard at the 1956 Republican National convention. It is sponsored by the officers, directors and friends of Liberty and Property, Inc., many of whom are listed above."

The leaflet further states that all mail should be sent to P.O. Box 180, San Francisco, until August 17, when the headquarters would open.

On August 10, 1956, San Francisco T-7 furnished an announcement captioned "San Francisco Conservative Republican Headquarters, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco." This announcement, which is dated August 3, 1956, stated that Conservative Republican Headquarters would be opened August 17, 1956 at 1263 Market Street and closed one week later on August 23, 1956. The announcement further stated that this downtown location would enable "us" to put on the kind of performance fitting for a movement which encompasses millions of patriots from coast to coast. It also stated that "we" would be able to put on a "show" in direct competition with other Market Street political headquarters "all of which are, of course, liberal."

The August 10, 1956 edition of the "San Francisco Chronicle", a San Francisco daily newspaper, page 6, contains an article entitled "Rightist Republicans to Open Headquarters at Convention Here." The article states that WILLIS CARTO, Executive Director of Liberty and Property, Inc., "a group which appears to be composed of ultra right-wing Republicans" made this announcement.

This article states that CARTO said he was not for EISENHOWER for President and that while his group had taken "no stand" on the nomination, Senators JENNER and MC CARTHY or Governor LEE of Utah are men who fit the program of his organization.

The August 24, 1956 edition of the "San Francisco Chronicle" published an article entitled "Governor LEE vs. The Income Tax." This article described "Conservative Republican Headquarters" as a vacant store at 1263 Market Street rented during the convention to serve as "a focal point for strategy in opposition to the schemes of the liberals" and "a nerve center for fast, organized action in case the unexpected happens." The article stated that among those present at a press conference was "WILLIE CARTO, the young executive director of an organization known as 'Liberty and Property' (which is footing the bill for the headquarters) who feels the U.S. should 'immediately withdraw from the impotent and subversive United Nations'."

The September 7, 1956 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle" printed a letter to the editor from WILLIS CARTO, Executive Director, Liberty and Property, San Francisco. CARTO stated that the "Chronicle" had misquoted him in printing that CARTO stated the United Nations was "impotent and subversive" CARTO stated that what he really said was that the United Nations was "impotent but subversive. Impotent for the purpose we created it, ie, to stop war, but subversive because of the haven it is for spies and because of its anti-national propaganda and activities which are designated to throw the American people unknowingly into a world government."

On August 23, 1956, San Francisco T-8 advised that on that day

At this time, CARTO said that he was not against labor as labor but was against the abuses perpetrated by the officials of labor unions and the injustices that they practice on the rank and file of the

union, the general public and the employers. According to SF T-8, CARTO was against foreign aid. He said that most bankers in the United States are against this give-away program. The only bankers who are for the aid program are those who, for one reason or another, are getting some of their money back through their banks or as individuals. CARTO said he was opposed to taking part in any war in the Middle East. He said it was best for the United States to keep out of any private throat-cutting in the Middle East or any other involvements. SF T-8 further advised that CARTO also stated that they do not consider the Jews as a whole as being good Americans or capable of being good Americans. CARTO stated that they do not intend to support the Arabs either.

On August 22, 1956, WILLIAM GILCHRIST, Manager, Cliff Hotel, San Francisco, furnished a leaflet entitled "Convention News" dated August, 1956, Special Republican Convention Edition #1. Page 2 of this leaflet reflected that "Convention News" was published singularly by the Non-Partisan League for Decency in Political Candidates, P.O. Box 1076, San Francisco.

On August 23, 1956, SF T-4 advised that P.O. Box 1076 was registered to Non-Partisan League for Decency in Political Candidates ("Convention News"), NPL, address c/o "Right" newsletter, 418 Ellis Street, San Francisco. The box was rented August 8, 1956.

On April 15, 1959, SF T-4 advised the above box was discontinued July, 1957.

On October 23, 1958, San Francisco T-9 furnished the following leaflet:

"STATEMENT BEFORE THE FOREIGN POLICY SUBCOMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS, REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION, AUGUST 15, 1956.

"I am WILLIS A. CARTO and I represent WE, THE PEOPLE, a national political-action group, and the CONSERVATIVE REPUBLICAN HEADQUARTERS, which is located at 1263 Market Street here in San Francisco for the convenience of conservative Republicans visiting this Convention as delegates or spectators. The former group has just secured the signatures of 100,000 persons on this Petition I hold in my hand. It will be presented to the Convention as a whole. It is for these 100,000 voters, as well as for the estimated 2000 persons who will visit our Headquarters and register there, that I present this statement.

"Billions of dollars of taxpayers' money have been and are still being given away to foreign countries. Two effects of this has been to prop up socialist governments and to prevent the balancing of our own budget. Another effect apparently has been the purchase of dozens of American firms by aliens who somehow divert our 'aid' money for this purpose. Furthur foreign spending should be confined to strictly essential military purposes which are in the interests of the United States, instead of opposed to them. Obviously, this would rule out the insane aid to Red Yugoslavia by the present Administration; aid which—if I recall the words of Republican Senator JENNER correctly—'border on treason.'

"For years our foreign policy has been opposed to the vital interests of the United States and the present Administration has continued this New Deal policy. Embroiling ourselves in the ancient hatreds and strifes of the world, our foreign policy is the sole cause of the horrifying rise of the Godless Communist Powers. At the present time, our meddling only seems to fit into the plans of these Powers for further world conquest.

"To start with, we must immediately withdraw from the impotent and subversive United Nations and all of its related organizations, and all UN property, employees and spies must be removed from American soil.

"We support a Bricker Amendment with teeth in it and deeply regret the present Administration's bitter opposition to this sensible protective measure.

"The 'Status of Forces' Treaty, which denies the protection of the Constitution to American servicement who are presumably fighting for that Constitution, must cease to receive support from the present Administration and must be rescinded.

"We are opposed to fighting anybody's wars in the Mid-East."

On April 20, 1959, SF T-2 furnished a leaflet received by SF T-2 in January, 1956 entitled "Liberty and Property, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco, California. This leaflet was dated January 10, 1955, although SF T-2 advised that from the contents of the leaflet it appeared to be mis-dated and should be dated January 10, 1956. The leaflet was addressed to "Dear Bay Area Patriot" and stated in part as follows:

"Remember the We the People convention in Chicago about three months ago? It was called for political action and patriots from coast to coast attended. There were over 600 of them there. In three days they worked out an organizational foundation upon which a National movement could be built.

"Well the time has come for bay area action on that foundation.

"Mr. WILLIS E. STONE, Western Director of We the People and President of the American Progressive Foundation of Los Angeles, is coming to the bay area next

week. While here, Mr. STONE plans to work with local patriots to establish an effective organization of all who want to help the American cause in the crucial election battle ahead."

This leaflet is signed BRUCE HOLMAN, Secretary, and WILLIS CARTO, Executive Director.

On September 11, 1957, SF T-3 furnished a copy of the September, 1957 issue of "Right" edited by BRADFORD MARTIN, P.O. Box 180, San Francisco. This issue carried a special article captioned "A Liberty Lobby is Needed" by WILLIS A. CARTO, P.O. Box 5311, San Francisco, which is quoted as follows:

"SPECIAL GUEST ARTICLE

"WILLIS A. CARTO'S past responsibilities incude being Executive Director of LIBERTY & PROPERTY, Inc., a Regional Vice-President of WE, THE PEOPLE, and Secretary for the CONGRESS OF FREEDOM. During the San Francisco Republican Convention he set up and directed the CONSERVATIVE REPUBLICAN HEADQUARTERS, which was visited by many hundreds of delegates and visitors. He is also the originator of the First National DIRECTORY of 'Rightist' Groups, which is going into its Third Edition at this time.

"He is now Corresponding Secretary for the LIBERTY LOBBY, a new concept which is attracting attention of patriots from coast to coast. It is scheduled to open in Washington July 4, 1958, or before if its budget is met earlier.

"A LIBERTY LOBBY IS NEEDED

"BY WILLIS A. CARTO

"(P.O. Box 5311, San Francisco 1, Calif.)

"Washington, D.C. is an occupied city. It has been captured by an aggressive coalition of minority special interest pressure groups. The federal government is the obedient servant of its captors, which band together as the occasion demands to manipulate government force in order to pry from the majority of Americans special privilege and power.

"There are economic, religious, racial and foreign pressure groups set up in Washington, all of them extremely well-organized and well-financed. Although not all of these minority special interest pressure groups are consistently inimical to American interests, in principle the system is bad. The entire system needs to be thrown out and a truly libertarian system re-established which will be in the interests of all the people, not just some.

"The Augean Stables need to be cleaned. A Second American Revolution is needed. But this presents many problems, the main one being simply that our side is not yet nearly strong enough nor well-organized enough.

"In the meantime, how can we cope with these grasping pressure groups? We must compete with them. We must compete with them on their own terms until such time as the entire pressure group system can be eliminated and government re-established in consistency with American traditions.

"Such a strategy requires the establishment of a beachhead on the battleground of Washington; am actual office must be set up, ready, willing and able to lock horns with the minority special interest pressure groups. Such an office must be backed up by thousands of voters. It will contact legislators on matters deemed vital to America by speaking for the citizen's whole and long-range interest, rather than his limited and shortsighted temporary interest. It will be a lobby for liberty and national sovereignty; a LIBERTY LOBBY!

"At present there are a few effices and individuals in Washington which do good work insefar as their limited activities allow. But a much larger and truly coordinated effort is needed, one which will utilize the cooperative effort of all of our big patriotic groups. With the backing of the membership of the biggest dezen or so of groups a LIBERTY LOBBY will be in a position to speak out firmly for the right.

"A LIBERTY LOBBY will complement and supplement the grass-roots work of the various new party groups and political action groups. Far from there being any conflict between the two types of operations, the LOBBY will work at the 'top' - right at the seat of federal power - while the grass-roots groups will continue their essential work at the 'bettem' - at the precinct and district level. Each type of operation will benefit the other. And together they will be far stronger than alone.

"A LIBERTY LOBBY will also bring Northern and Southern groups together for political action. This will pave the way for the long-overdue formal coalition of conservative forces which is so desperately needed.

"United, the patrictic forces in America can outstrip even the most aggressive and vocal of the minority special interest pressure groups. This is because every patrict-member of the LIBERTY LOBBY will be an active and outspoken member. Such is by no means the case with the much-feared labor lobby, or teachers' lobby, or the racial lobbies. Most individual members of these lobbies are themselves too good Americans to want special favors and hand-outs at government expense. In spite of their bembast, the minority special interest pressure group bosses do not speak for all of their members.

"Now is the time for Americans to organize together in order to accomplish what we cannot accomplish alone. Now is the time for a LIBERTY LOBBY!"

On April 22, 1955, SF T-3 furnished a leaflet on "The Congress of Freedom Convention" to be held April 25 through 30, 1955 at Veteran's War Memorial Auditorium, San Francisco. This leaflet described the Congress of Freedom as "a coalition of patriotic American organizations which are concerned with increasing tendencies towards internationalism through the United Nations." The name WILLIS A. CARTO was one of 24 names listed under Board of Directors.

The April 21, 1955 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", page 7, column 1, reflects that according to ROBERT T. LE FEVRE, the Congress of Freedom, which was to meet in San Francisco in the coming week, was set up about five years ago as a "coalition of what are known in modern parlance talk as right-wing organizations". about 500 of them in all. The article reflected that as LE FEVRE answered questions, it developed that the Congress does not consist of organizations at all, but of 500 individuals who are affiliated with various organizations. These individuals may or may not be official representatives of those organizations, according to the article. The article also stated that LE FEVRE conceded that if you eliminate local chapters of national organizations, then maybe only 100 or so organizations are The article further identified Liberty and involved. Property, Inc. as one of the organizations to be represented officially, according to LE FEVRE.

The article stated that LE FEVRE appeared in San Francisco the day before at the helm of the Congress of Freedom.

The May 1, 1955 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", page 14, column 2, reflects an article entitled "'Congress of Freedom' Ends with Clash on Religious Issue." This article stated in part that "the 'Congress of Freedom', a 'coalition of right-wing forces' concluded its week long meeting here yesterday with a series of resolutions, blasting the United Nations, its agencies and its supporters in the United States.

"Before the resolutions were approved, however, the 80 to 100 voting delegates beatdown two attempts to change language so as to avoid offending hon- Christians."

On September 18, 1957, SF T-3 furnished the first National directory, third edition, which is self-described as a directory of "Rightist" Groups, Publications, and some Individuals in the United States (and Some Foreign Countries.) This directory included Liberty Lobby, Box 5311, San Francisco, California, WILLIS A. CARTO, Corresponding Secretary.

On January 20, 1959, SF T-4 advised that P.O. Box 5311 was rented July, 1957 and is assigned to W. A. CARTO. His business was indicated as "Publicity."

On October 31, 1958, SF T-6 furnished the November, 1958 issue of "Right", from which resumes of several articles are set out as follows:

One article entitled "Northern League Office Opened" reflected that the first North American Office of the Northern League had been established in Sausalito, California. The article stated that "the object of the Northern League is cultural; to create better relations between 'white' people of all nations. In this way, the mutual misunderstandings will be eliminated, which have so far resulted in two terrible world wars and which now weaken the resistance of Christendom in its fight for survival."

The article further stated that "N.B. HOLT, Sausalito resident, has been named local organizing secretary of the branch. Dr. E. L. ANDERSON, brilliant retired professor and author whose articles have often appeared in 'Right' will assist in organizational work.

"Mailing address is P.O. Box 67, Sausalito, California. Dues are \$3 per year. Members are placed

on the mailing list of 'The Northlander', monthly news review of Pan-Nordic Affairs, and receive free league literature and consultations."

Another article entitled "Our Foreign Policy is Outdated" was written by WILLIS A. CARTO. In this article, CARTO criticized President EISENHOWER and Vice-President NIXON for allowing the Russians to get so far ahead of the United States in many military projects, and also, for allowing the USSR to steal many of the military secrets of the U.S. military forces.

On October 31, 1958, SF T-6 furnished a leaflet on the aims and principles of the Northern League. This leaflet reflects the California Office to be P.O. Box 67, Sausalite, California, USA and the head office to be 23, Rolland Square, Dunfermline, Scotland.

On December 30, 1958, San Francisco T-10 advised that the CARTO family consists of the Subject, WILLIS ALLISON CARTO, who is also referred to as AL CARTO, his father, WILLIS F. CARTO, his mother, LOUISE The parents reside CARTO at 495 South Russell Road, Mansfield, Ohio. Subject's family went to Mansfield, Ohio, in about 1943 from Fort Wayne, Indiana. At that time, the Subject was a senior in high school and remained in Fort Wayne to graduate. After high school the Subject entered the U.S. Army and served in numerous campaigns in the Far East. He reportedly was wounded and received the Purple Heart. After his military service, he attended Dennison College. After this he was affiliated with Proctor and Gamble, Cincinnati, Ohio. He later terminated this position and around 1950 or 1951 he went to Florida for a couple of months and "knocked around. During this brief period of time, he was believed to have been bell-hopping at a hotel in Florida, possibly Miami or Miami Beach. Subsequent to this, he gained employment with the Household Finance Company, city unknown to SF T-10, and later transferred with the company to their San Francisco Office. He later ceased this employment and commenced his own printing concern, which SF T-10 understands to be the printing of leaflets, folders, and so forth for others. SF T-10 added that during November, 1958 the Subject married a German girl who had been in this country only a short time.

On April 20, 1959, SF T-2 advised that CARTO was a World War II veteran and that CARTO endeavored to secure an appointment to the Subversive Activities Commission of the California Department of the American Legion in 1957 and was quite bitter over an alleged broken promise for the District Commander's recommendation. The Subversive Activities Commission turned down his appeal to them as not falling within their jurisdiction.

On March 19, 1959, Reeves Apartments, 1451 Larkin Street, San Francisco,

advised SAs and ZAVEN JARDARIAN that had resided there for approximately one year and that Subject has resided there only since his marriage ____in November, 1958. She stated that the Subject and his wife were good tenants, causing no trouble and she added that since she has known the Subject she has only known him to be away from San Francisco for a period of approximately one week in February, 1959. She stated she had noticed only one constant visitor, a gray-haired woman. On March 20. 1959, the Subject was interviewed and FRANK S. PERRONE, at which by SAs time the Subject advised that he had received some literature of an anti-Semitic nature from various places in the country, from an individual with the pen name of "The Patriot. He stated he wondered who "The Patriot"

might be inasmuch as most persons who engage in Rightist activities do not attempt to conceal their identities. He stated he had not saved any of this literature. He further advised that his segment of those engaged in Rightist activities does not indulge in hate activity nor does it believe in engaging in any activity of an illegal nature.

b6 b7C Progress Report #7, dated August 1, 1956, on the letterhead of Liberty and Property, Inc., Post Office Box 180, San Francisco, California, identified WILLIS CARTO as Executive Director of Liberty and Property.

A communication dated June 15, 1956, on the letterhead of Liberty and Property, Inc., Post Office Box 180, San Francisco, described Liberty and Property, Inc., as primarily "another one of the dozens of Right Wing political action groups."

A photostat copy of a letter written by WILLIS CARTO in 1955 reflected he had made a trip throughout the United States and contacted numerous Rightist Nationalist organizations and individuals. This letter also stated that CARTO was contacting groups which were against communism, against communist infiltrated state governments, the Supreme Court decision on segregation, and the letter further stated that he had also contacted groups called the "Citizens Councils of the Southern States," which were against desegregation. The letter stated that the purpose of his trip was to contact people concerning Liberty and Property, Inc., with the end of gaining some important support for it. The letter indicated he had been successful in getting this support.

A leaflet entitled, "The Second Edition of the New Enlarged First National Directory of 'Rightist' Groups, Publications and Some Individuals in the United States (and Some Foreign Countries)," received in November 1955, reflected that this Directory of "Rightist" groups, publications, and some individuals, described in the title, was being published for sale as a special service by Liberty and Property, Inc., Post Office Box 180, San Francisco, California. San Francisco, reflected that it was necessary to create a means whereby all new developments and new, as well as tried and true, ideas could be expressed, and consequently, "We are proud to announce that this marks the beginning of publication of 'Right,' a new monthly bulletin of, by, and for the American Patriotic Movement. In order to be effective, 'Right' intends to report, without bias or favoritism, all significant activity of the American Right Wing. As we define it, this means any organization or group, which is interested primarily in one or two basic essentials, qualifies for such matter. Because of the vast scope of the ideals envisioned by the groups concerned, these two criteria are necessarily negative. The two negative criteria are Anti-Marxism and Anti-Internationalism. Taken together, these two principles come close to meaning Americanism in our book.

The September 1960 issue of "Right" was self-described as the last issue of "Right."

The October 31, 1958, issue of "Right" contains an article entitled, "Northern League Office Opened," which article reflects that the first North American Office of the Northern League had been established in Sausalito, California. The article stated that, "The object of the Northern League is cultural; to create better relations between 'white' people of all nations. In this way, the mutual misunderstandings will be eliminated, which have so far resulted in two terrible world wars and which now weaken the resistance of Christendom in its fight for survival."

The article further stated that, "N. B. HOLT, Sausalito resident, has been named local organizing secretary of the branch. Dr. E. L. ANDERSON, brilliant retired professor and author, whose articles have often appeared in 'Right,' will assist in organizational work. Mailing address is P. O. Box 67, Sausalito, California. Dues are \$3.00 per year. Members are placed on the mailing list of 'The Northlander,' monthly news review of Pan-Nordic Affairs, and receive free league literature and consultations."



This passport was valid for three years travel to all countries except Albania and those portions of China, Korea, and Viet-Nam under communist control. His mailing address was given as Post Office Box 5311, San Francisco, California.

It is noted that, under current passport regulations, this passport may be used by the bearer for lawful travel within the period of its validity whenever and as often as desired without further notification to the Department of State or other Government agency.

EUROPA AND THE BULL

A recent issue of postage stamps on the continent symbolises the new De Gaulle-Adenauer movement towards a united Europe by a picture of the maiden Europa riding on a bull.

This false allegory illustrates the cultural ignorance of those who lead Europe today. The mythological story of the rape of Europe, although retold in the Iliad, bringing in the name of Zeus, was derived from non-European sources, and the similarity between the name Europe and that of the maiden Europa is entirely coincidental.

Europa was the daughter of the Phoenecian King Agenor, and the bull is the bull of Anu, a Semitic God, which, having induced the maiden Europa by a show of tameness to climb upon its back, swam off through the sea with her to the island of Crete, where she bore three children to her assailant.

The eldest of the three children was Minos, who annually caused seven Athenian youths and seven Athenian maidens to be thrown alive to the Minatour, until the latter was finally killed by the Nordic-Greek hero Hercules.

There is nothing inspiring, pleasant or even European about the story (except the slaying of the Minotaur by the European hero Hercules) and the mere similarity of names should not mislead us into adopting an alien and revolting legend to symbolise a resurgent Europe. Ironically an Adenauer-De Gaulle victory would indeed result in the raping of a captive Europe by the bull Anu!

Germany Under The Equalitarian Jackboot

"LIBERALS" PLOT THE END OF A TEUTONIC NATION

GERMANY is now truly under attack from both external and internal forces. Paralysed as Germany is by partition and the Communist giant on her borders, "liberals" are now taking advantage of the international position to de-racialise the country both intellectually and practically.

At least, the liberals are **trying** to do this.

But the Northlander believes their efforts will have just the reverse effect, for there is something in every Teutonic heart which invariably cries out against repression. Although there is already much submissive non-Teutonic blood in Germany, the Teutonic element is still strong, and will resist the equalitarian jackboot as it has always resisted slavery and oppression.

LIBERAL PLANS

To destroy the German people racially, the liberals are now urging the admission of Asian and African workers into Germany, ostensibly "to aid the German economy." Yet they know that in the long run nothing would destroy the German economy more effectively than the destruction of the entire German race by intermarriage with the alien immigrants which are now being planted on German soil.

The latest scheme is the importation of 10,000 Pakistani labourers! These, added to the numerous half Negro children left behind by American Negro troops during the occupation, would have an enormous effect on the character of the German population within just two generations.

BRAINWASHING CHILDREN

On the intellectual side, the destruction of the Nordic race in Germany is to be aided by brainwashing the children in the schools, and even the universities! Freedom of intellectual life in educational institutions is to come to an end.

To achieve this brainwashing, a "Commission of Enquiry on Civil Liberties" has been formed, consisting of twelve men, for the express purpose of limiting the civil rights of freedom of speech and thought in places of higher education. This Commission will advise the Government on teaching in schools and colleges as a means of combatting "religious intolerance" and "racial prejudice." What could be more intolerant or even more prejudiced than this latter aim?

EAST GERMANY

1. Facts.

Figures are now available on the number of farmers and farm-workers who have fled the Soviet zone of Germany during this year. The final compulsory phase of collectivisation was instituted in the first months of this year and in this time 2,715 farmers who formerly owned and operaed farms in Central Germany fied to the West. This amount shows an increase of 296 per cent over the same period in 1959. Since January 1954 a total of 17,676 farmers and 10,625 members of their families have abandoned their homes and sought refuge in the Federal Republic. In addition some 49.126 farm-workers have also fled to the West during this period.

2. Farce.

An outrage was discovered by the Folk Art section of the Soviet Zone Communist Party's Cultural Affairs Board recently. There was consternation when it was found that a school text book for teaching the recorder contained music that was rife with "reactionary bourgeois aesthetic and rank chauvinism"! There were only three tunes of "pro letarian nature" while some twenty-five were all historic folk-songs written long before Karl Marx formulated his inferiority complex. Worse still, it was found that the editor of the book had expressed a notion about "art for art's sake" when it is well known that this theory only serves the purposes of "decadent capitalism" and that art is for the party's sake alone!

The Future of our Race - 8

THE RACIAL FUTURE IN AMERICA

By Edward Langford

WITH two great powers, Russia and the United States of America, dominating the world today, the attitude of both these countries to our Race is of the utmost significance. Although in the recent Olympic sports in Rome, Russia was represented mainly by Nordic-Slav competitors, and the United States to a considerable extent by Negroes, the fact remains that at the present time the Government of the Soviet Union still follows Communist race-mixing theories — even to the extent of pretending that the biological heritage is totally insignificant in human affairs — while the United States still contains a majority population of Nordic or North European descent, and so might be expected to work loyally for the preservation of our white race.

What is popularly called the "White Race" is, of course, primarily of "Nordic" or North European origin, for it was the British, Germanic and Scandinavian peoples who established the old kingdoms of France, Italy and even once dominated the Spanish scene. It was the British, Germanic and Scandinavian family of nations, also, who pioneered the establishment of the "White" peoples in North America, and who by demanding their ancient Nordic rights of individual freedom and self-government, won freedom for the United States of America and also for the now independent dominion of Canada, in just the same way that their Saxon and Viking ancestors in Britain had won freedom from their continental kindred in Europe after migrating to Britain from the European mainland across the North Sea.

RISE OF GANGSTERISM

The United States was always Nordic in character from the time of the first pioneer settlements in North America until the second half of the nineteenth century, when many migrants began to enter the United States from southern Italy, Sicily, southern Portugal and Spain, and new slums began to appear, which later produced the famous gangsters of the 1920s, and which still produce the overwhelming majority of rackateers and professional criminals, if one discounts for a moment the generous contribution of the coloured peoples to these undesirable classes. It has been one

of the most marked factors of American history, that the Nordic people — that is to say those whose forefathers came from the North European countries — have engaged themselves with the pioneer work of cultivating the wilderness, and establishing industry and science, building railways and roads in this rich new continent, and have contributed but little to the vice and sordid crime which lurk everywhere in the backstreets of the great cities which have arisen in this fair land. New York and Washington, which are amongst the leading crime centres of the U.S.A., have some of the lowest percentages of Nordic true-white American citizenship.

BECOMING A MINORITY

The Immigration Act of 1924 officially restricted immigration from non-Nordic countries to about 12 per cent, but unfortunately it failed to prevent illegal immigration, it failed to prevent subsequent special legislation to permit non-Nordic immigration under special acts, and it failed to prevent the inequality of birth rate between the Nordic people of America of English, Scots, German, Scandinavian ancestry, and those of southern European, Negro and Chinese origin. As a result the true-Whites in America are fast becoming a minority group - however astonishing or disturbing that fact may seem.

The remedies would appear to be easy. Africa, for instance, could easily absorb the relatively sophisticated American Negro population,

and possibly benefit by that very sophistication. Liberia was formed for the very purpose of acting as a home for American Negroes. A state aided programme could ship the entire Negro population back to Africa, each with a handsome grant to assist in resettlement in the newly independent African continent, at much less cost than America spends on foreign aid. Similar arrangements could be made for other non-White groups, and such migration would undoubtedly in the long run greatly benefit the migrants. As the total population of these groups increases in America, then the U.S.A. herself will otherwise be faced with increasing taxes to provide social services and aid, and will find herself priced out of world markets.

EFFECT OF SLUMP

In the ensuing slump, it is the Negro, Mexican and Puerto Ricans, etc. who will suffer the most. Their comfortable stay in the U.S.A. will, of necessity, merely bring about economic conditions equivalent to those of the homelands they have left, and instead of bringing about a permanent improvement in their own standard of living, merely bring down the present high American standard in the direction of their level.

This of course could not happen if their numbers were to remain small, but as the world knows, the percentage of coloured and half-coloured people in America is increasing year by year. The hard fact is that the true-Whites have only small families; while the non-Whites have usually three to five children in a family, not counting the large numbers of illegitimate chidren which they also produce outside of wedlock.

But unfortunately Government opinion in the U.S.A. appears to be pressurised by economic and political factions which see the coloured vote as a means to controlling the country, and the coloured workman as a source of cheap labour. As a result the general government policy follows the false and blind "meltingpot" ideal, oblivious to the fact that the melting-pot race-mixing factor is precisely the same factor which has destroyed almost every great civilisation of the past, from Ancient Egypt, to Ancient Greece, Rome, India and Persia. There is only one

EURASIONS MIGRATING TO AMERICA

Holland's population of "Indo's," half-Dutch half-Indonesian and people, are rapidly migrating to the United States of America, according to recent reports in the Dutch press. Six thousand have already been admitted to the U.S.A. under the American Fugitives Act, and another nine thousand under the Walter Pastore Act, specially created for this community. This latter law has been extended, and within two further years a total of twenty-five thousand Indonesian-Dutch mixed bloods will have migrated from Holland to America.

CLIMATE TOO COLD

Possibly the entire community would migrate, but for the restrictions upon their entry into the States. They report that they like neither the cold damp climate of Holland nor the settled ways of the Dutch people.

This migration, however, carries with it little relief for the Dutch people. A small nation, they have a total of a quarter of a million "Indo's" living in their small and hitherto outstandingly Nordic country. This coloured community breeds so rapidly that it is estimated there will be one million coloureds in Holland, before the close of the century. Into the bargain, their number is being continually reinforced by other **Indo's** who had formerly elected to adopt Indonesian nationality and remain in the country of their birth. Fifty-thousand more of such spytoptanten are shortly to be admitted to Holland. A spytoptant is an Indo who formerly chose Indonesian nationality but now regrets this (spyt = regret) and now "opts" (opteert) to migrate to Holland.

Thus it seems that Indonesia is getting rid of its mixed bloods, at the expense of the Nordic race. But the heaviest guilt lies with the Dutch Governor General Coen who encouraged such intermarriage in the first place.

The Wereld Kroniek, reporting earlier this year, claimed that Indos normally married amongst people of their own community; but those clinations.

who live in Holland state that Indo males are normally to be seen accompanied by Nordic women, and the Dutch press has done its best to encourage intermarriage. Add to the fact that Indo families normally average five children, there has been a vast influx of West Indians who are also to be seen in Dutch cities today, and one realises that unless drastic action is taken in the near future, Holland will soon be lost to our race.

TEXANS OPPOSE INTEGRATION

Houston, more than any other part of Texas, has fallen under the heel of capitalist-liberal domination, yet still the Texan people of that great city have succeeded in rejecting a carefully prepared campaign to integrate Houston schools.

Supported though this plot was by big-business of non-Texan ownership, voters rejected the proposal by two to one. The only localities which favoured the proposal, in fact, were those comprised entirely of Negro voters.

NEGROES FAVOUR SEGREGATION

While Negroes generally seek integration as a means to "social improvement," when they achieve integration by migration into the northern towns they tend of their own accord to resegregate in their own communities.

There is nothing wrong or demeaning about this, it is a natural and entirely proper function. So real, also, is this tendency, that were it not for the interim harm caused to both committees by the transitional period of integration one might feel that it were better to remove all restrictions and merely encourage the various races in America to follow their own inclinations.

NORDIC AMERICA

By EDWARD LANGFORD

AMERICA was first discovered by the Viking Leif Ericsson, centuries before North Italian Columbus reached the West Indies. Viking settlements were made on the coast of New England, but appear to have survived barely a generation. The settlers did not number more than a few dozen, and as Indian attacks are recorded, it is presumed that, as with the Greenland settlements, the earliest pioneers must have been annihilated by hostile

Then in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries the Anglo-Saxon and Frankish peoples began to colonise and develope North America on a major scale. In time, the Frankish settlements in Canada and Louisiana fell under Anglo-Saxon control, and then in the nineteenth century the Anglo-Saxon settlers were reinforced by largescale migrations of Teutons, or continental Saxons from Holland and North Germany. The Declaration of Independence was a restatement of the traditional rights of Nordic freemen — but, even at that time; people like Abraham Lincoln never intended that the state should include men of all races. Instead. Lincoln and Grant both supported schemes for the re-transfer of American Negroes back to their own homeland in Africa, and Liberia was established especially for this pur-

Unfortunately these plans were not fulfilled, and in the latter part of the nineteenth century economic conditions in southern and central Europe caused a mass migration of non-Nordic peoples into North America, who, ever since have continued to produce larger families than the original Nordic settlers. The result has been that their numerical importance has grown vastly.

Under the influence, largely, of author Madison Grant (The Passing of the Great Race) and Lothrop Stoddard (The Rising Tide of Colour) — both names deprecated by the modern powers-that-be in America — the Immigration Act of 1924 was passed, which limited official Non-Nordic immigration to 12 per cent. But it was too late. The damage was done, with a large non-Nordic population reproducing at

more than twice the rate of the Nordic pioneers, and wholesale illegal and semi-legal immigration of Mexicans and Puerto Ricans, plus special relaxations in favour of refugees from Germany and other European countries.

True Nordics today are strong in the mid-West, and in the old South. But New England and most of the larger cities have large alien populations, and the Negro problem is not the only one in the modern U.S. Worst of all, the film industry, large sections of the press, the entire "entertainment" world, a great deal of banking, and most political influence, has fallen into the hands of non-Nordics.

These non-Nordic elements have no genuine feeling for the Delaration of Rights or other historic documents, as their own way of life shows, when contrasted to that of the law-abiding Nordic true-American elements, but these, and any other handles to political power, are ruthlessly used to subvert the Nordic backbone of the nation. Those who did not know the courage with which individual Nordics in America are

S. Navy Base in Cuba or CIA might come up with another "USS Maine" to give the U. S. an excuse to invade Cuba with the Marines. He said that the primary goal of FPCC is to prevent intervention in Cuba and allow the Cubans







The Noontide Frees, Post Office Mox 713, Sausalite, Californie, is distributing copies of a second edition of "Imperium" which was written originally in 1948 by FRANCIS FARKER YOCKEY under the new de plume of ULICK VARANCE. This edition was copyrighted in 1902 and published by The Truth Seeker Company, 38 Park Row, New York.

Publicity issued by The Moontide Press in connection with this edition alleged that 'Imperium' was suppressed by ensaies of western civilization, that the author was hounded for years, that he was held unconstitutionally under the enormous bail of \$50,000 although no charges were placed against him, and that he committed suicide because of continued harassment. The book originally appeared in two volumes and the second edition has been combined into a single volume of over six hundred pages with a thirty-five page introduction by W. A. CARTO.

The introduction by CARTO declares that YOCKEY was a gifted writer who studied languages and became a linguist but that it was as a philosopher that he reached the ausmit. CARTO noted that YOCKEY practiced law in Illinois and in Detroit as an Assistant County Attorney for Wayne County, after receiving an honorable medical discharge from the Army in 1942. CARTO alleges that YOCKEY never lost a case as a lawyer.

CARTO points out in his introduction that YOCKEY went to Europe after receiving a job with the War Crimes Tribunal and that he concluded that the entire procedure of these war crime trials was serving the interest of international communication

CARTO declares that YOCKEY prepared reports for the war crime triels for eleven months and terminated the employment because a superior advised him these reports had the wrong slant and that he would have to rewrite the reports to conform with "official viewboint".

CARTO alleges that the only orime of YOCKEY was to write a book, Imperium and that for this he had to die.

CARTO alleges that the State Department in 1952 refused to remem the passport of YOCKEY and that a game then developed between the FBI and YOCKEY because the FBI had received instructions to keep YOCKEY under surveillance at all times. When YOCKEY's whereabouts was known, the FBI matched him night and day, according to CARTO. When he dropped temporarily from aight, as he did frequently, his friends, relatives and contacts allegedly were interrogated constantly by agents who kept repeating they just wanted to talk to him.

carro concludes that the spectacle of a man being persecuted, framed and driven to his death simply because he wrote a book is not one which could be expected in the 20th Century in the land of the free and the home of the brave. CARTO asks, however, whether people in the United States are free when a person whose only crime was to write a book is denied a passport, when a citizen can be arrested without a warrant and held in jail without charges and under fantastic bail, when "free press" vultures can heap scorn upon his head, when a sensitive genius can be held in the filthiest of jails with Negro and white criminals, and when a judge can rule that a prisoner is not to have a speedy and public trial by an impartial jury?

CARTO emphasizes that YOCKEY was neither pro-Russian nor anti-Russian, although "certain of his captors" called him anti-American and pro-Russian". He also elleges that accusations of "anti-Semitian" should be interpreted on the same level.

CARTO declares that some weeks after YOCKEY's death by suicide the man who had been charged with railroading him, the United States Attorney, suddenly and without explanation resigned from his job, left his wife and children, and joined a monastery.

A source advised on March 4, 1963, that mailed copies of the book Imperium enclosed a reprint of an article from Right', 59, August, 1960, which contained an article entitled Creative Genius Driven to Suicide'. This article alleged that YOCKEY's doom was realed from the mement Imperium was published. The Anti-Defamation League reportedly began a world-wide persecution of YOCKEY and the United States allegedly questioned hundreds of people at a cost of thousands of dollars because he was "suspected of heading an international conspiracy against the Government." The article alleged that these persecutions caused YOCKEY to utilize false names and passports as a result of which he was arrested in Oakland on June 6, 1960, with three passports and held for \$50,000 bail. The article alleged that YOCKEY then suffered the following illegalities and civil rights violations:

- 1. The FBI arrested him without a werrant in violation of the Fourth Amendment.
- 2. His bail was set at \$50,000 by Judge JOSEPH KARESH, an Ordained Rabbi.
- 3. He suffered cruel and unusual punishment in the City Jell.
- 4. The papers misquoted YOCKEY and whipped up public hatred against him.
- 5. He was denied interviews with friends.

The article concluded that YOCKRY learned that no jury trial was to be allowed and that he lost hope, causing him to commit suicide. His death, however, has made him a martyr for ideas - ideas that will not die with a thousand Anti-Defamation Leagues.

A letter accompanying mail orders of the second edition of Imperium publicates the availability of another book by YCCKEY, allegedly written and given to a few close friends a few months before his death and published in July, 1961. This booklet is identified as The World in Flames and reportedly deals with the approaching war between Russia and the West.



In the April, 1965, issue of "Western Destiny," lower left hand corner, page 2, the following information was set forth:

"Western Destiny is published monthly. It is the successor to 'Northern World' which published Volumes I-VII from 1956 through Spring, 1963, and its successor, 'Folk,' which published Volume VII through December, 1963. Subscription price, \$4.00 per year throughout the world; student and library rate, \$3.00. 35¢ per issue newsstand price. Bulk prices of same issue, 20¢ each for 5 copies or more. Advertising rates upon request. Business and circulation office: P.O. Box 713, Sausalito, California; editorial office: P.O. Box 881, Milwaukee, Misconsin. Original manuscripts will be considered for publication but not returned unless an addressed, stamped envelope is sent along."

In a printed letter dated October 11, 1965, which carried the caption "Western Destiny, P.O. Box 76062, Los Angeles, Calif. 90005," the letter among other things, informed:

"Western Destiny is intended for people who think. It seeks to supply a positive philosophy for victory. We believe that Conservatism is a dynamic force - not an out-dated way of life. 'Western Destiny' is the most significant magazine on the Right. No one proud of his family, Nation or Race can afford to be without it..."

The story, to be about 2,000 to 2,500 words in length and to be published in paperback, would require a review of newspaper morgues and interviews with individuals in Northern California who could give information about a politician who allegedly was elevated to riches and power by the "invisible government" This person reportedly would be EARL WARREN. Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. The story would deal with the murder of EARL WARREN's elderly father, and the inference to be drawn from individuals interviewed and from newspaper morgues was that EARL WARREN, in a fit of rage, murdered his father. The date was probably in 1936 or 1937 and reportedly is available in the newspaper morgues.

CARTO was initially said to be willing to pay \$200 for a rough draft of the story, but subsequently raised this amount to \$500. CARTO was said to be an official of Liberty Lobby and the owner of the publication "Western Destiny", the "Noon Tide Press", Post Office Box 713, Sausalito, California, and the "American Mercury", Post Office Box 7213, Houston, Texas.

The source further stated that CARTO had reported during the Fall of 1964 that he was moving his base of operations of Liberty Lobby from San Francisco to Post Office Box 1622, Washington, D.C. He was also to set up a base for Liberty Lobby at Post Office Box 76062, Los Angeles, California 90005, and at Post Office Box 36132, Los Angeles, California 90036. On November 17, 1966, Mr. ROBERT DALE BAKER, News Director, Radio Station KSRO, Santa Rosa, California, advised he had written a letter to Chief Justice EARL WARREN, U. S. Supreme Court, because he had received information that some author was planning on writing a fictional story with fictional characters, but based on events in the early private life of WARREN. BAKER stated that the book was supposedly to be pure fiction, but it was to be slanted in such a way that everyone would be aware that it was about WARREN who would be the central character. BAKER advised that his reason for writing the letter to WARREN was that he wanted him to be aware of this "smear", but he did not desire to put enough information in his letter so that his source would be divulged. Hr. BAKER said that the person who allegedly is interested in having a book of this nature published possibly lives in Los Angeles, California. Columnist DREW PEARSON reportedly is aware of the plans for such a book, but BAKER advised he had no way of knowing how much information PRARSON actually possessed.

BAKER advised that he would not disclose the identity of his source of this information.

'Nazis' Take Over Youth for Wallace

C EORGE WALLACE, the ex-Governor of Alabama and ex-candidate for President, doesn't know about it, but his former youth organization has turned into a budding Hitler youth movement.

It happened almost without anyone knowing about it, in the ways things happen where Nazis are concerned.

The founders of "Youth for Wallace" had every intention of keeping the organization intact under a new name, National Youth Alliance. However, they made the mistake of getting obligated financially to Willis Carto, founder of the Liberty Lobby and mastermind of the new neo-Nazi movement in the United States.

* * *

THE takeover of the Wallace youth movement was clinched at a regional National Youth Alliance leadership conference, January 25, at Conley's Motel outside Monroeville, Pa. Carto sent Curtis B. Dall, figurehead president of Liberty Lobby, a neo-Nazi front, to address the morning session.

The evening session was taken over by the Francis Parker Yockey movement, with Carto himself as the guest of honor. The late Yockey, whose book "Imperium" has become the new "Mein Kampf," is the patron saint of the neo-Nazi movement.

The Conley's Motel meeting on January 25 was attended by doctors, lawyers

and businessmen from the Pennsylvani-New York area, who were identified only by code names but were disciples of Yockey

Most of the National Youth Alliance leaders were patriotic conservatives. They were stunned when they found their meeting room hung with Nazi banners. The assembled neo-Nazis even showed off their collection of Nazi war relics.

The meeting began with the singing of the Nazi anthem, Horst Wessel Lied, followed by a series of strident speeches.

A FTER this frenzied evening, the national youth leaders tried to cut loose from Carto. He refused to be severed, First, he demanded that they turn over to him all the organization's assets. He claimed that National Youth Alliance was a branch of Action Associates, one of the many front groups he controlled.

This was followed by brief legal maneuvering. The National Youth Alliance leaders, however, couldn't raise the funds to continue the fight. They resigned en masse after sending a letter to local alliance leaders, dated March 24, explaining their action.

After their walkout, the National Youth Alliance fell under the complete control of the neo-Nazi Francis Parker Yockey movement and Willis Carto



This case was reopened in view of an article by DREW PEARSON appearing in the "San Francisco Chronicle" newspaper 4/17/69. This column was devoted to WILLIS CARTO and liberty lobby and in this article there is mention made of the Moontide Press in Sausalito. This is an obvious typographical error and should be the Noontide Press.

The Noontide Press in the past maintained a Post Office Box 713 at the Sausalito, California, Post Office. On 5/15/69, Postmaster, advised that the Noontide Press, which press formerly held P. O. Box 713, had closed this box on 7/1/67, and left a forwarding address of Post Office Box of 76062, Los Angeles, California.

In this connection it is to be noted that the "San Francisco Chronicle" of 5/26/69, carried an article concerning the Noontide Press and listed the address for the Noontide Press as Torrence, California.

An examination of the Marin County Telephone Directories and Street Address Directories failed to disclose any listing for the Noontide Press in Marin County.

On 5/15/69, and on 6/23/69, was contacted in connection

with WILLIS CARTO.

for a group called the Northern League and for the Noontide Press, stated that he has not had anything to do with WILLIS CARTO for years. He stated that he does not belong to the Liberty Lobby or anyother group with which CARTO is associated. In fact, he stated it is his opinion that WILLIS CARTO is a phony and he believes that the information printed in PEARSON's column was furnished to PEARSON by CARTO.

CARTO are not active in the Northern California area and that the activity of CARTO and his group presently is centered in Washington, D. C., and for this reason it is recommended that this case be closed, subject to reopening in the event of further information concerning activity of CARTO in this area.
